The euro area economy lost more momentum than expected as consumer and business confidence weakened and car production in Germany was disrupted by the introduction of new emission standards; investment dropped in Italy as sovereign spreads widened; and external demand, especially from emerging Asia, softened. Elsewhere, natural disasters hurt activity in Japan. Trade tensions increasingly took a toll on business confidence and, so, financial market sentiment worsened, with financial conditions tightening for vulnerable emerging markets in the spring of 2018 and then in advanced economies later in the year, weighing on global demand. Conditions have eased in 2019 as the US Federal Reserve signaled a more accommodative monetary policy stance and markets became more optimistic about a US-China trade deal, but they remain slightly more restrictive than in the fall.

The Story of the FAO Library - 65th Anniversary 1952-2017 is a journey through the events that led to what has become one of the world’s finest collections of materials (both digital and print) on food, agriculture and international development. Today, the library is the depository of over one and a half million volumes, plus a collection of 400 rare books, 32 incunabula (books printed before 1501) and thousands of digital publications. Its origins lie in the International Institute of Agriculture (IIA), founded in Rome in 1905 by King Vittorio Emanuele III to defend and modernize agriculture, with the encouragement of David Lubin, an American citizen and passionate promoter of agricultural knowledge. Lubin committed to creating and developing the Institute’s library, soon the reference point for research centres, governments and other agencies specialized in agricultural matters. In the aftermath of World War II, the legacy of the IIA and its unique library were closely safeguarded by FAO. FAO’s library, which officially opened in 1952, was named after Lubin “in recognition of the foresight, leadership, and outstanding contribution ... to international co-operation in the field of agriculture.” This publication unveils the library’s precious collections, ranging from those inherited from the Marquise Raffaele Cappelli, second President of the IIA, to the atlases, periodicals, yearbooks and even an edition of Alexander von Humboldt’s *Cosmos* from the Centre International de Sylviculture collection. The publication’s text is accompanied by photographs and images taken from the archives, showing rare pieces ranging from the incunabula to exquisite hand-drawn illustrations. And what about today? Already as of the 1970s, the library had embarked on digitalization, providing access to technologies and supporting libraries in some 90 developing countries via FAO’s decentralized offices. As the book reveals, the Library continues to rise to the digital challenge, maintaining its pivotal role in knowledge dissemination.

anniversario - Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations 2018-05-11
La Biblioteca della FAO celebra il suo 65° anniversario nel 2017. La pubblicazione vuole commemorare questo evento offrendo una panoramica degli eventi storici che hanno portato alla nascita della biblioteca ed alla sua evoluzione fino ad oggi, illustrando l'importante ruolo svolto nella gestione delle informazioni sull'agricoltura a livello mondiale. La storia della Biblioteca della FAO ha inizio con la sua antesignana, la Biblioteca dell'Istituto Internazionale di Agricoltura (IIA). L'IIA fu fondato a Roma nel 1905 da Re Vittorio Emanuele III per realizzare il sogno di David Lubin (1849-1909), cittadino statunitense di origini polacche che aveva dedicato la sua vita al servizio di quello che chiamava "gli Stati Uniti del Mondo"¹. Quando venne fondata nel 1945, la FAO prese sotto la propria egida l'IIA poiché "la

differenza tra le due organizzazioni riguarda più le dimensioni che gli intenti fondamentali. Alla base dei programmi di entrambe vi è la preoccupazione per il contadino e per l'agricoltura"2. Tale connubio riguardava principalmente la Biblioteca dell'IIA, che a quel tempo comprendeva una delle più grandi collezioni al mondo relativa alla ricerca agricola, con i suoi 400.000 volumi sull'agricoltura, tra cui una raccolta di 400 libri rari e 32 incunaboli, un'eredità preziosa per una biblioteca che ancora oggi ha l'obiettivo di sostenere la FAO nel suo ruolo di diffondere la conoscenza. La Biblioteca della FAO venne inaugurata ufficialmente a Roma nel giugno del 1952 con il nome Biblioteca David Lubin, "come riconoscimento della lungimiranza, della leadership e dello straordinario contributo di David Lubin alla cooperazione internazionale nel settore dell'agricoltura"3. Nel corso degli ultimi 65 anni la Biblioteca ha accorpato al patrimonio dell'IIA la sua collezione composta da pubblicazioni FAO e non, raccogliendo e conservando ogni singolo documento della FAO pubblicato. Oggi la Biblioteca della FAO non solo ospita un milione e mezzo di volumi, che costituiscono la memoria dell'Organizzazione, ma svolge anche un ruolo di primo piano nella digitalizzazione dei contenuti, nella disseminazione delle pubblicazioni della FAO e rappresenta una fonte inesauribile di informazioni sull'agricoltura a livello mondiale. *Sangiovese, Lambrusco, and Other Vine Stories* - Attilio Scienza 2019

The World of Sicilian Wine - Bill Nesto

The World of Sicilian Wine provides wine lovers with a comprehensive understanding of Sicilian wine, from its ancient roots to its modern evolution. Offering a guide and map to exploring Sicily, Bill Nesto, an expert in Italian wine, and Frances Di Savino, a student of Italian culture, deliver a substantive appreciation of a vibrant wine region that is one of Europe's most historic areas and a place where many cultures intersect. From the earliest Greek and Phoenician settlers who colonized the island in the eighth century B.C., the culture of wine has

Sicily is only now rediscovering the quality of its indigenous grape varieties, such as Nero d'Avola, Nerello Mascalese, Frappato, Grillo, and distinctive terroirs such as the slopes of Mount Etna.

Pizza and Pizza Chefs in Japan: A Case of Culinary Globalization - Rossella Ceccarini

Jerusalem Without God - Paola Caridi 2017
