*Lovecraft* - Esteban Maroto 2018-02

Illustrated in haunting black and white over 30 years ago, these comics are re-presented in a new edition, adapting three of H.P. Lovecraft's most famous stories involving the Cthulhu Mythos. "The Nameless City"

is considered the first story of Lovecraft's Cthulhu Mythos, detailing the discovery of an ancient city in the deserts of the Arabian Peninsula built by an unnamed race of beings of reptilian appearance. In "The Festival" a man arrives at the sea town of Kingsport, Massachusetts during Christmas but finds a place eerily empty and centuries out of date. "The Call of Cthulhu" is perhaps Lovecraft's most famous story, describing a man who after finding the notes of his grand-uncle is lead on a journey around the world in search of this mysterious and disturbing phenomenon.

*The Gods of Mars* - Edgar Rice Burroughs 2020-05-24T01:36:48Z

*The Gods of Mars* is Burroughs' sequel to *A Princess of Mars*. After ten long years, John Carter is again transported to Mars to try and determine the fate of his wife Dejah Thoris, but finds himself in the forbidden Valley Dor, from which no man may return. Published serially in five parts between January and May 1913, this sequel appeared a year after the initial serialization of its predecessor. It was eventually published in its full novel form in 1918. Although the Martian series contains ten books in total, the first three—of which *The Gods of Mars* is the second—are often considered a stand-alone trilogy. Throughout the series, Burroughs' imagination and sense of adventure shine through, and his extravagant prose and innovative vocabulary raise the works up above run-of-the-mill pulp fiction. This book is part of the Standard Ebooks project, which produces free public domain ebooks.

*Escape on Venus* is the fourth book in the Venus series (Sometimes called the "Carson Napier of Venus series") by Edgar Rice Burroughs. "Dagon" is the second story of the writer H.P. Lovecraft, written in 1917 and published for the first time, in 1919. The work takes its title from the mythological God Dagon, and tells a disturbing story, happened years before to a man with the obsession of suicide. Before throwing himself from the window of his attic, this man writes some notes related to his mental state. Then, he began to recall an old story that happened in the years of the First World War: suddenly, he finds himself a prisoner of a German ship in the Pacific Ocean. After only five days, the protagonist manages to escape with a raft. Wandering for days, adrift in the sea, one afternoon he finds himself stranded on a disquieting and apparently deserted island. Immediately he notices that in the mud, a lot of rotting fish are stranded...

*Ghost Rider* made his first appearance in *Tim Holt* issue #11, published by *Magazine Enterprises*, in May, 1949. The character combined a mixture of two distinct genres: horror and western. *Ghost Rider* was created by artist Dick Ayers and writer Ray Krank for the title's editor, Vincent Sullivan. In the original story, *Ghost Rider* is the Calico Kid and his horse is called *Ebony*. The only person who knows his true identity is Sing Song his Chinese sidekick. His persona changed in the second outing, this time he was *Rex Fury*, a Federal Marshal and his horse was now renamed *Spectre*. The *Ghost Rider*'s fate was sealed with introduction of the Comics Code Authority in 1954. The CCA was formed by the comic book industry amid concern about 'inappropriate material' in many comic books, this included horror and *Ghost Rider* was shelved. *Batman (2011-) #29* - Scott Snyder

After leaving Creepy magazine, for the landmark Dracula graphic novel, Jones enlisted Supergirl co-creator/writer Otto Binder and Star Trek, Twin Earths and Creepy artist Alden McWilliams to adapt Stoker's novel. Legendary Dracula actor, Christopher Lee even provides an Introduction! For Halloween 2021, Vanguard has enlarged, revised, and expanded, this historic but long-out-of print classic in a luxurious hardcover edition with a new historic essay by How To Draw Chiller Monsters author, J.
