Oldstone-Moore adeptly lays to rest common misperceptions about beards and vividly illustrates the connection between grooming, identity, culture, and masculinity. Steamships turned round-the-world travel into a luxurious experience, as with the tours of Thomas Cook & Son. Famous authors wrote up their adventures, including Mark Twain and Jack London and Elizabeth Jane Cochrane (better known as Nellie Bly). Finally humans took to the skies to circle the globe in airplanes. Not much later, Sputnik, Gagarin, and Glenn pioneered a new kind of circumnavigation—in orbit. Through it all, the desire to take on the planet has tested the courage and capacity of the bold men and women who took up the challenge. *Hair, Art, and Identity Project* - Imani Davis 2022

The Hair, Art, and Identity Project aims to teach children that hair is an important aspect of a person's identity, and find a way for them to showcase their hair and identity through art. Hair expresses a person's culture, personality, gender, religion, and racial identity to others and it tells the world a person's story. This thesis project was completed within two weeks in a fourth-grade class at an elementary school in the suburbs of Chicago, Illinois. It was divided into two sections: the first week consisted of four read-alouds of children's books that showcased different hair cultures. The second week involved students creating a two-dimensional art project using different materials to create their hairstyle that connects to their identity, and writing a short artist statement that talks about what their work says about their hair identity. The Hair, Art, and Identity Project explores the two questions: How can art be used to encourage students to explore the link between their hair and identity as well as others around them? What conversations will children engage in when given the topics hair and identity? It uses the methodology of critical action research in two ways: first, by having students engage in whole group and small group discussions about relevant topics such as conversational hair stories, sharing their knowledge about other hair cultures, and answering read aloud questions; and second, through students participating in a hands-on art project that further explored their own connection between their hair and identity. Children are at an age where they are still learning and beginning to understand the world around them. Teaching children about hair and identity through art allows them to understand more about their own identity, teaches them to respect different cultures, religions, etc., and allows them to gain a better understanding of our shared humanity. As an artist and educator, I want to cultivate spaces of belonging and showcase values around dignity and diversity.
