Fin dal 1860, il nostro Paese è stato insanguinato da attentati compiuti contro le massime autorità dello Stato e da massacri che hanno colpito centinaia di cittadini inermi. Dal re al papa, dai capi di partito agli uomini di governo, fino a magistrati, poliziotti, imprenditori e giornalisti, è lunghissima la lista delle vittime di una violenza che, col

passare degli anni, non si è mai placata; al contrario, si è fatta sempre più ardita ed efferata, fino a invadere "zone franche" quali luoghi di culto (l'attentato contro la sinagoga di Roma, nel 1982) e di studio (la bomba contro la scuola di Brindisi nel maggio del 2012). A cambiare sono, di volta in volta, gli autori. E, da questo punto di vista, la nostra storia - oltre alle stragi compiute in tempo di guerra o quelle del terrorismo internazionale, comuni a tutto l'Occidente - è stata caratterizzata da anomalie criminali tutte italiane, come la mafia, il brigatismo e le cosiddette "stragi di Stato", con inconfessabili complicità nei gangli più reconditi delle istituzioni. Il libro ripercorre questi terribili fatti di sangue, che hanno avuto effetti devastanti nell'evoluzione del nostro Paese e sono rimasti indelebili nella nostra memoria collettiva: dagli eccidi commessi in nome della "ragion di Stato" sotto il Regno sabauda alle rappresaglie naziste, dai blitz messi a segno dai terroristi palestinesi e dai

fondamentalisti islamici alla "strategia della tensione", dagli atti più cruenti delle "guerre di mafia" alle vite umane sacrificate nelle missioni militari internazionali. The Story of Tönle - Mario

Rigoni Stern 1998

Mario Rigoni Stern was born in 1921 in Asiago, in the mountains of northeastern Italy. Throughout his literary career, he has remained deeply attached to the region of his birth, its peasant customs, its dialect, its seasonal cycles and shifting historical fortunes. Tonle Bintarn's story takes place in the mountains of the Veneto region, which once bordered the Austro-Hungarian Empire and where smuggling was a means of subsistence for the peasant population. Having run afoul of a patrol of revenue agents, Tonle must seek refuge beyond the frontier in Central Europe, where year after year he lives by doing odd jobs and working, among other things, as an itinerant print peddler, a horse trainer in Hungary, and a gardener in a Prague castle. But every winter he returns secretly to his home and family, until finally a pardon is granted. By now his children are grown and he has little to do but tend his sheep. Meanwhile, the times are changing, social values are

disintegrating under the impact of modernization, and Europe moves ever closer to disaster. During the devastation of the First World War, the occupation and ultimate destruction of his village, and his own internment in an Austrian camp, it is Tonle's loyalty to his roots and his stubborn devotion to his task as a shepherd that persist and make him a quiet symbol of heroism and human endurance.

Confessions of an Italian - Ippolito Nievo 2014-05-29

An overlooked classic of Italian literature, this epic and unforgettable novel recounts one man's long and turbulent life in revolutionary Italy. At the age of eighty-three and nearing death, Carlo Altoviti has decided to write down the confessions of his long life. He remembers everything: his unhappy childhood in the kitchens of the Castle of Fratta; romantic entanglements during the siege of Genoa; revolutionary fighting in Naples; and so much more. Throughout, Carlo lives only for his twin passions in life: his dream of a unified, free Italy and his undying love for the magnificent but inconstant Pisana. Peopled by a host of unforgettable characters - including drunken smugglers, saintly nuns, scheming priests, Napoleon and Lord Byron - this is an epic historical novel that tells the remarkable and

inseparable stories of one man's life and the history of Italy's unification. Ippolito Nievo was born in 1831 in Padua. Confessions of an Italian, written in 1858 and published posthumously in 1867, is his best known work. A patriot and a republican, he took part with Garibaldi and his Thousand in the momentous 1860 landing in Sicily to free the south from Bourbon rule. Nievo died before he reached the age of thirty, when his ship, en route from Palermo to Naples, went down in the Tyrrhenian Sea in early 1861. He was, Italo Calvino once said, the sole Italian novelist of the nineteenth century in the 'daredevil, swashbuckler, rambler' mould so dear to other European literatures. Frederika Randall has worked as a cultural journalist for many years. Her previous translations include Luigi Meneghello's *Deliver Us* and Ottavio Cappellani's *Sicilian Tragedy* and Sergio Luzzatto's *Padre Pio: Miracles and Politics in a Secular Age*. Lucy Riall is

Life Of Galileo - Bertolt Brecht 2015-02-13

This Student Edition of Brecht's classic dramatisation of the conflict between free enquiry and official ideology features an extensive introduction and commentary that includes a plot summary, discussion of the context, themes, characters, style and language as well as questions for further study and notes on words and phrases in the text. It is the perfect edition for students of theatre and literature. Along with *Mother Courage*, the character of Galileo is one of Brecht's greatest creations, immensely live, human and complex. Unable to resist his appetite for scientific investigation,
