This book employs conceptual frameworks drawn from theories of institutional change and innovation to explore the rise in homelessness in the US, the 'lineages' of responses to the problem, and the subsequent rise of HF.

Il sistema del verde viene oggi riproposto in alcuni piani urbanistici più recenti secondo un disegno di struttura caratterizzato dalla continuità e dal paradigma reticolare; esso è utilizzato come componente primaria di un'operazione di riqualificazione ed integrazione della città consolidata e della città contemporanea caratterizzata dalla diffusione insediativa. La ricerca indaga su: i nuovi significati attribuiti al verde urbano con l'impiego del paradigma reticolare continuità/integrazione; il ruolo che questo può assumere quale strumento di riqualificazione ed integrazione urbana, a partire dal riutilizzo degli open space in dismissione e degli spazi residuali; la reale fattibilità ed efficacia, insieme ai limiti, delle tesi generali e delle sperimentazioni progettuali proposte o avviate su questi temi. Il campo di approfondimento è offerto dalle tesi sulla riqualificazione urbana di Rogers e dal dibattito e le riforme da queste suscitate che hanno determinato l'impostazione del Nuovo Piano di Londra (2003) e dalle prime sperimentazioni progettuali avviate per la riqualificazione di parti della città. Il percorso consente di verificare l'applicabilità di queste tesi alla riqualificazione della città europea. Le motivazioni ed il campo problematico della ricerca prendono le mosse dal considerare la larga disponibilità nella città contemporanea, insieme alle grandi aree di dismissione, di aree e spazi minori residuali del processo insediativo; come queste aree siano riconducibili a tipologie e fattori assai diversi, come esse siano oggetto di usi impropri o inadeguati; infine come i comportamenti ricorrenti nella progettazione tendano a trascurare o ignorare questi residui o ad utilizzarli in una visione frammentata dello

spazio pubblico e del verde. Recenti esperienze hanno dimostrato come questi spazi ed aree residue possano essere oggetto di una strategia più complessiva per la riqualificazione della città contemporanea.

Housing Change in East and Central Europe - Sasha Tsenkova 2017-05-15

Ten years after the fall of the Berlin Wall, patterns of change to the former communist nations of Europe are now discernible in a way that was impossible to see in the initial years. This insightful book focuses on the case of changes in housing based on evidence collected from across the Central and Eastern European region. The volume adopts a conceptual framework and provides cross-regional analysis, amongst which is situated a series of more focused case studies. Issues examined include the consequences of the rapid privatization of state rental housing including the emergence of 'super-owner-occupied' countries, dramatic changes in urban structure and evidence that housing, having been the shock absorber against which wider economic restructuring has occurred, now faces a whole series of deferred problems. The enthusiasm with which the market economy was initially embraced must now be tempered by a more sober assessment of what in reality has happened.

How to House the Homeless - Ingrid Gould Ellen 2010-06-24

How to House the Homeless, editors Ingrid Gould Ellen and Brendan O'Flaherty propose that the answers entail rethinking how housing markets operate and developing more efficient interventions in existing service programs. The book critically reassesses where we are now, analyzes the most promising policies and

programs going forward, and offers a new agenda for future research. How to House the Homeless makes clear the inextricable link between homelessness and housing policy. Contributor Jill Khadduri reviews the current residential services system and housing subsidy programs. For the chronically homeless, she argues, a combination of assisted housing approaches can reach the greatest number of people and, specifically, an expanded Housing Choice Voucher system structured by location, income, and housing type can more efficiently reach people at-risk of becoming homeless and reduce time spent homeless. Robert Rosenheck examines the options available to homeless people with mental health problems and reviews the cost-effectiveness of five service models: system integration, supported housing, clinical case management, benefits outreach, and supported employment. He finds that only programs that subsidize housing make a noticeable dent in homelessness, and that no one program shows significant benefits in multiple domains of life. Contributor Sam Tsemberis assesses the development and cost-effectiveness of the Housing First program, which serves mentally ill homeless people in more than four hundred cities. He asserts that the program's high housing retention rate and general effectiveness make it a viable candidate for replication across the country. Steven Raphael makes the case for a strong link between homelessness and local housing market regulations—which affect housing affordability—and shows that the problem is more prevalent in markets with stricter zoning laws. Finally, Brendan O'Flaherty bridges the theoretical gap between the worlds of public health and housing research, evaluating the pros and cons of subsidized housing programs and the economics at work in the rental housing market and home ownership. Ultimately, he suggests, the most viable strategies will serve as safety nets—"social insurance"—to reach people who are homeless now and to prevent homelessness in the future. It is crucial that the links between effective policy and the whole cycle of homelessness—life conditions, service systems, and housing markets—be made clear now. With a keen eye on the big picture of housing policy, How to House the Homeless

shows what works and what doesn't in reducing the numbers of homeless and reaching those most at risk.

In che termini l'architettura interpreta l'esigenza comunitaria nell'era della globalizzazione e della conseguente evoluzione dei fenomeni urbani anche alla luce di una crescita esponenziale dell'espressione comunitaria virtuale? Partendo da questo primo interrogativo critico il Festival raccoglie una serie di materiali e testimonianze che dimostrano anche il superamento dell'identificazione esclusiva del tema con le grandi tipologie collettive pubbliche, architettoniche e urbane, dell'esperienza storica. Tuttavia, pur attraverso il rilievo di fenomeni insediativi non caratterizzati, articolazioni tematiche differenziate e contributi apparentemente riferibili alla soggettività dell'autore quanto del fruitore, sembra confermarsi come il dato comunitario possa ancora "essere individuato e declinato in diverse forme, attraverso diversi ambiti, a dimostrazione della sua ineludibilità". In what terms is architecture interpreting community need in the era of globalisation with the ensuing evolution in urban phenomena, in view also of an exponential growth in virtual community expression? Beginning from this first critical enquiry, the Festival has gathered together an array of information and evidence which demonstrate also the surmounting of this theme as being solely identified with the grand collective typologies - be they public, architectonic or urban - of historical experience. Nonetheless, albeit through the remarking of non-characterised settlement phenomena, differentiated thematic divisions, and contributions seemingly referable as much to the subjectivity of their creator as of the beneficiary, there would appear to be corroboration of just how the community datum can still "be identified and declined in various forms, across various spheres, in demonstration of its ineluctability".
