On Her Own Ground - A'Lelia Bundles 2002-01-01

Soon to be a Netflix series starring Octavia Spencer, *On Her Own Ground* is the first full-scale biography of "one of the great success stories of American history" (The Philadelphia Inquirer), Madam C.J.
