Così ne I Malavoglia una famiglia di pescatori di Aci Trezza dà voce a un romanzo corale in cui l'attaccamento alla tradizione familiare arcaica, che sembra l'unica possibile ancora di salvezza, si avvia a un triste naufragio. Mastro-don Gesualdo narra la storia del rivolgimento sociale di una classe che decade e di una classe che tenta di emergere, con la vicenda esemplare di un muratore arricchito che consacra tutte le proprie energie allo sterile amore per la "roba". Sono questi i temi ricorrenti anche nella novellistica verghiana, non solo quella di argomento siciliano: la lotta incessante e disperata per la sopravvivenza, il conflitto per il bisogno e per il possesso, il desiderio di elevarsi che si rivela inutile, di fronte all'accanirsi di un destino segnato. Qui si trovano alcune delle pagine più riuscite di Verga: quelle di Rosso Malpelo e La roba. Giovanni Verga nacque nel 1840 a Catania, dove trascorse la giovinezza. Nel 1865 fu a Firenze e successivamente a Milano, dove venne a contatto con gli ambienti letterari del tardo Romanticismo. Il ritorno in Sicilia e l'incontro con la dura realtà meridionale indirizzarono dal

1875 la sua produzione più matura all'analisi oggettiva e alla resa narrativa di tale realtà. Morì a Catania nel 1922. Di Verga la Newton Compton ha pubblicato I Malavoglia, Mastro-don Gesualdo, Storia di una capinera, Tutte le novelle e Tutti i romanzi, le novelle e il teatro.

Challenging the Mafia Mystique - Rino Coluccello 2016-04-29

The Sicilian Mafia, or Cosa Nostra, is one of the most intriguing criminal phenomena in the world. It is an unparalleled organised criminal grouping that over almost two centuries has been able not only to successfully permeate licit and illicit economy, politics and civil society, but also to influence and exercise authoritative power over both the underworld and the upper-world. Předkládaná publikace si klade za cíl prozkoumat některé z hlavních změn v oblasti derivační morfologie, k nimž došlo v literární italštině mezi 16. a 19. stoletím. Kniha chce přispět k obvyklé charakteristice post-renesanční italštiny třemi důkladnými studiemi o slootovorných prostředcích, které prošly zajímavými změnami pod různými diachronními vlivy. Text nabízí v první řadě analýzu formací se sufixem -gione, jehož postupné vymizení je známé. Poté jsou analyzována substantiva derivovaná pomocí sufixu -zione, který představuje jeden z nejdůležitějších prostředků derivace dějových jmen. Nakonec je zvláštní pozornost věnována kompozici, jež je obvykle

považována za „neustále se rozšiřující oblast“, a to zejména verbonominálním kompozitům, která byla vždy v popředí zájmu lingvistů. Kromě kvalitativních aspektů, obvykle dobře popsanych v odborné literatuře, je hlavní důraz kladen na kvantitativní charakteristiky, jež se ve zvoleném období ukazují jako zcela zásadní pro další vývoj.

Deftly combining serious biography with critical commentary, Mallach begins with the captivating story of Mascagni's rags-to-riches adventure, from his birth in Livorno in Tuscany, to his musical studies first with Alfredo Soffredini and later at the Milan Conservatory, to his years as a vagabond musician, to the worldwide success of his breakthrough opera. He then traces Mascagni's private and professional life after *Cavalleria*, examining a prolific yet controversial career that was forever overshadowed by the work that unexpectedly thrust him into the limelight. Mallach provides a full analysis of

Mascagni's oeuvre and discusses his complex relationships with such Italian cultural and political figures as Edoardo Sonzogno, Giacomo Puccini, Gabriele D'Annunzio, Luigi Illica, and Benito Mussolini. He also thoroughly chronicles Mascagni's bouts with manic depression, his marriage to Lina and devotion to their three children, his grueling schedule of concert and operatic tours, his patriotism and bitter opposition to Italy's involvement in both world wars, and his passionate love affair with Anna Lolli. This richly textured biography will appeal to fans of the still beloved and popular Cavalleria, and it will introduce opera enthusiasts to the power, intensity, and melodic beauty of the brilliant composer's many other significant works.

Sicily and the Unification of Italy - Lucy Riall 1998-03-12

This is the first in-depth analysis of the impact of Italian unification on the hitherto isolated communities of rural Sicily. Traditional explanations of Sicily's instability depict a society trapped by a feudal past. Lucy Riall finds instead that many areas of the island were experiencing a period of rapid modernization, as local government increased their organizational efforts. Beginning with the period prior to the revolution of 1860, Dr Riall shows why successive attempts at political reform failed, and analyses the effects of this failure. She describes the bitter and violent conflict between rival elites and the mounting tide of peasant unrest which together threatened the status quo within the isolated communities of the Sicilian interior. Through an examination of the problems of local government - tax collection, conscription, the organization of policing - and of attempts to suppress peasant disturbances and control crime, she shows that the modernization of the Sicilian countryside both undermined the control of the central government and made the countryside itself more unstable.

The Cesare Lombroso Handbook - Paul Knepper 2013-01-03

The Italian criminologist Cesare Lombroso (1835 - 1909) is the single-most important figure in the founding of criminology and the study of aberrant conduct in the human sciences. The Cesare Lombroso Handbook brings together essays by leading Lombroso scholars and is divided into four main parts, each focusing on a major theme. Part one examines the range and scope of Lombroso's thinking; the mimetic quality of Lombroso; his texts and their interpretation. The second part explores why his ideas, such as born criminology and atavistic criminals, had such broad appeal. Developing this, the third section considers the manners in which Lombroso's ideas spread across borders; cultural, linguistic, political and disciplinary, by including essays on the science and literature of opera, 'La donna delinquente' and 'Jewish criminality'. The final part investigates examples of where, and when, his influence extended and explores the reception of Lombroso in the UK, USA, France, China, Spain and the Philippines. This text presents interdisciplinary work on Lombroso from academics engaged in social history, history of ideas, law and criminology, social studies of science, gender studies, cultural

studies and Jewish studies. It will be of interest to scholars, students and the general reader alike.

Suicide in Modern Literature - Josefa Ros Velasco 2022-01-01

This book analyzes the social and contextual causes of suicide, the existential and philosophical reasons for committing suicide, and the prevention strategies that modern fictional literature places at our disposal. They go through the review of Modern fictional literature, in the American and European geographical framework, following the rationales that modern literature based on fiction can serve the purpose of understanding better the phenomenon of suicide, its most inaccessible impulses, and that has the potential to prevent suicide. From the turn of the 20th century to the present, debates over the meaning of suicide became a privileged site for efforts to discover the reasons why people commit suicide and how to prevent this behavior. Since the French sociologist and philosopher Émile Durkheim published his study *Suicide: A Study in Sociology* in 1897, a reframing of suicide took place, giving rise to a flourishing group of researchers and authors devoting their efforts to understand better the causes of suicide and to the formation of suicide prevention organizations. A century later, we still keep on trying to reach such an understanding of suicide, the nature, and nuances of its modern conceptualization, to prevent suicidal behaviors. The question of what suicide means in and for modernity is not an overcome one. Suicide is an act that touches all of our lives and engages with the incomprehensible and unsayable. Since the turn of the millennium, a fierce debate about the state's role in assisted suicide has been adopted. Beyond the discussion as to whether physicians should assist in the suicide of patients with unbearable and hopeless suffering, the scope of the suicidal agency is much broader concerning general people wanting to die.
