Moreover, recent problems with the availability and strain-specificity of vaccine for annual flu epidemics in some countries and the rise of pandemic strains of avian flu in disparate geographic regions have alarmed experts about the world's ability to prevent or

The report describes what steps the United States and other countries have taken thus far to prepare for the next outbreak of "killer flu."
