The tale darkens when Rami is captured and enslaved by a cruel feudal lord. The lovers, separated by circumstances beyond their control must confront inexorable realities harsher than caste prejudice. Now, it is a matter of life and death. Their desperate wish to be reunited and their subsequent struggle is interwoven with the poetry of Chandidas and the rich oral tradition that surrounds his life. Ultimately, this is a story of passion, heartbreak, transformation, and commitment to a powerful vision. So today while she is venerated as Chamunda, a deity who verges on the macabre and grotesque, she is also adored in household shrines in one of her milder forms, Dakshina-Kali. It is this evolution of Kali—from her origin as a tantric goddess to her metamorphosis into a divinity in mainstream religion—that Seema Mohanty captures brilliantly in this book. Drawing upon a variety of sources—rituals associated with the worship of Kali, tales from the Ramayana, the Mahabharata, the Puranas, the Tantras and Agamas, folklore and films—she has succeeded in portraying in engrossing detail the myriad manifestations of the enigmatic deity that is Kali.
