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Historical Dictionary of Italian Cinema - Gino Moliterno 2020-12-08
Italian cinema is now regarded as one of the great cinemas of the world. Historically, however, its fortunes have varied. Following a brief moment of glory in the early silent era, Italian cinema appeared to descend almost into irrelevance in the early 1920s. A strong revival of the industry which gathered pace during the 1930s was abruptly truncated by the advent of World War II. The end of the war, however, initiated a renewal as films such as *Roma città aperta* (Rome Open City), *Sciuscià* (Shoeshine, 1946), and *Ladri di biciclette* (Bicycle Thieves, 1948), flagbearers of what soon came to be known as Neorealism, attracted unprecedented international acclaim and a reputation that only continued to grow in the following years as Italian films were feted worldwide. Ironically, they were celebrated nowhere more than in the United States, where Italian films consistently garnered the lion's share of the Oscars, with Lina Wertmüller becoming the first woman to ever be nominated for the Best Director award. This second edition of *Historical Dictionary of Italian Cinema* contains a chronology, an introduction, and an extensive bibliography. The dictionary section has over 400 cross-referenced entries on major movements, directors, actors, actresses, film genres, producers, industry organizations and key films. This book is an excellent resource for students, researchers, and anyone wanting to know more about Italian Cinema.

Italy through the Red Lens - Gianluca Fantoni 2021-04-08

This book offers the first comprehensive analysis of the role of cinema in the communication strategy of the Italian Communist party (the PCI). It examines the entire period during which the party had a systematic and organized approach to cinematographic production, starting with the early experiments in 1946 and concluding with the closure of PCI film company Unitelefilm at the end of the 1970s. Its analysis sheds light on a

range of issues, such as the relationship between the party and Italian intellectuals, the Stalinist imprint of the Italian Communist Party and the historical significance of the Salerno turn, the PCI's relationship with the student movements in 1968 and 1977, and the PCI's response to the rise in political violence in the 1970s. Ultimately, the book demonstrates that cinema was essential to the PCI's propaganda effort.

Ansano Giannarelli ha vissuto il proprio tempo nel segno della passione, del rigore e della libertà creativa. Le regie, la riflessione storico-critica, l'insegnamento universitario, l'attività di produzione, conservazione e promozione del cinema, la militanza politica a sinistra, si annodano in questa singolare figura di cineasta e intellettuale, rivoluzionario gentile, convinto, con Zavattini, che il cinema e la televisione debbano essere strumenti di conoscenza e di impulso al pensiero «di tutti». Per la Fondazione Archivio audiovisivo del movimento operaio e democratico, di cui egli è stato fondatore e presidente, la sua è una straordinaria eredità culturale, che questo volume a più voci prova a ricostruire e a restituire.

Elsa Morante's Politics of Writing - Stefania Lucamante 2014-12-18
Elsa Morante's Politics of Writing is a collected volume of twenty-one essays written by Morante specialists and international scholars. Essays gather attention on four broad critical topics, namely the relationship Morante entertained with the arts, cinema, theatre, and the visual arts; new critical approaches to her four novels; treatment of body and sexual politics; and Morante's prophetic voice as it emerges in both her literary works and her essayistic writings. Essays focus on Elsa Morante's strategies to address her wide disinterest (and contempt) for the Italian intellectual status quo of her time, regardless of its political side, while showing at once her own kind of ideological commitment. Further, contributors tackle the ways in which Morante's writings shape classical oppositions such as engagement and enchantment with the world, sin and repentance, self-reflection, and corporality, as well as how her engagement in the visual arts, theatre, and cinematic adaptations of her works garner further perspectives to her stories and characters. Her works—particularly the novels *Menzogna e sortilegio* (House of Liars, 1948), *La Storia: Romanzo* (History: A Novel, 1974) and, more explicitly, *Aracoeli* (Aracoeli, 1982)—foreshadowed and advanced tenets and structures later affirmed by postmodernism, namely the fragmentation of narrative cells, rhizomatic narratives, lack of a linear temporal consistency, and meta- and self-reflective processes.

This volume proposes a rich corpus of papers about the 'Other City', a subject only few times dealt with, but worthy of all our attention: it imposes itself on the scene of international modern and contemporary historiography for its undeniable topicality. Throughout history, the city has always had to deal with social 'otherness', i.e. with class privileges and, consequently, with discrimination and marginalization of minorities, of the less well-off, of foreigners, in short, with the differences in status, culture, religion. So that the urban fabric has ended up structuring itself also in function of those inequalities, as well as of the strategic places for the exercise of power, of the political, military or social control, of the spaces for imprisonment, for the sanitary isolation or for the 'temporary' remedy to the catastrophes. From the first portraits of cities, made and diffused at the beginning of the fifteenth century for political exaltation purposes or for religious propaganda and for devotional purposes, which often, through increasingly refined graphic techniques, distort or even deny the true urban image, we reach, at the dawn of contemporary history, the new meaning given by scientific topography and new methods of representation; these latter aimed at revealing the structure and the urban landscape in their objectivity, often unexpected for who had known the city through the filter of 'regime' iconography. The representation of the urban image still shows the contradictions of a community that sometimes includes and even exalts the diversities, other times rejects them, showing the unease of a difficult integration.

Ben-Ghiat sees these films as part of the aesthetic development that would lead to neo-realism. Shot in Libya, Somalia, and Ethiopia, these movies reinforced Fascist racial and labor policies and were largely forgotten after the war. Ben-Ghiat restores them to Italian and international film history in this gripping account of empire, war, and the cinema of dictatorship.

Students and scholars across a range of disciplines, including Italian studies, political philosophy, sociology, history, visual and cultural studies, race and whiteness studies and gender studies, will find this book of interest.

Come si costruisce la memoria del passato? È possibile affermare che i media e, in particolare, quelli audiovisivi abbiano modificato le pratiche sociali e culturali del ricordo? Quali canali percorre oggi la parola del testimone? In quale modo si sono trasformati gli atti performativi dei lasciti memoriali, dal momento che la trasmissione dei ricordi personali si sta sempre più volgendo verso un modello transgenerazionale? Privilegiando una prospettiva antropologico-visuale, il volume cerca di rispondere a queste domande a partire da un'indagine sull'immagine documentaria, nelle sue molteplici trasmissioni mediali: dal

documentario alle installazioni multimediali, dal cinema sperimentale agli archivi digitali on line, dai musei audiovisivi ai film amatoriali. La ricerca si basa sulla ricostruzione storico-teorica dei principali contributi nel settore dei Memory Studies in relazione agli studi sul cinema e i media audiovisivi. Nello specifico, il testo propone l'analisi di tre pratiche documentaristiche, capaci di interpretare e attestare i nuovi costrutti genealogici e le più recenti forme di eredità delle memorie: il found footage, realizzato con film privati; la videotestimonianza; le immagini-souvenir girate nei luoghi del post-trauma.

Italian Colonialism - R. Ben-Ghiat 2016-04-30

Italian Colonialism is a pioneering anthology of texts by scholars from seven countries who represent the best of classical and newer approaches to the study of Italian colonization. Essays on the political, economic, and military aspects of Italian colonialism are featured alongside works that reflect the insights of anthropology, race and gender studies, film, architecture, and oral and cultural history. The volume includes many essays by Italian and African scholars that have never been translated into English. It is a unique resource that offers students and scholars a comprehensive view of the field.

The Maciste Films of Italian Silent Cinema - Jacqueline Reich 2015-10-19

Italian film star Bartolomeo Pagano's "Maciste" played a key role in his nation's narratives of identity during World War I and after. Jacqueline Reich traces the racial, class, and national transformations undergone by this Italian strongman from African slave in *Cabiria* (1914), his first film, to bourgeois gentleman, to Alpine soldier of the Great War, to colonial officer in Italy's African adventures. Reich reveals Maciste as a figure who both reflected classical ideals of masculine beauty and virility (later taken up by Mussolini and used for political purposes) and embodied the model Italian citizen. The 12 films at the center of the book, recently restored and newly accessible to a wider public, together with relevant extra-cinematic materials, provide a rich resource for understanding the spread of discourses on masculinity, and national and racial identities during a turbulent period in Italian history. The volume includes an illustrated appendix documenting the restoration and preservation of these cinematic treasures.

Le stragi di Portella della Ginestra, Piazza Fontana, Brescia, Ustica, Bologna o i tentati golpe De Lorenzo e Borghese, i "casi" Mattei, Moro, Ambrosoli e l'omicidio di Pier Paolo Pasolini o il G8 di Genova: sono alcune tra le principali "strane storie" che costellano la vicenda repubblicana italiana, nodi apparentemente inestricabili di un passato/presente che il volume intende ripercorrere proiettandone la visione e l'interpretazione nella cornice del grande schermo cinematografico. I contributi raccolti analizzano in tale prospettiva alcuni capolavori della storia del cinema italiano ma anche film del tutto sconosciuti, evidenziando le modalità in cui, negli uni e negli altri, l'immaginario dei cosiddetti "misteri italiani" ha trovato spazio di trattazione. L'intento è quello di proporre una nuova lettura di uno spaccato di cinema e di storia italiani che possa altresì gettare una pur minima luce sulle zone più buie della nostra "notte della repubblica".

Sicily on Screen - Giovanna Summerfield 2020-03-13

With its physical beauty and kaleidoscopic cultural background, Sicily

has long been a source of inspiration for filmmakers. Twelve new essays by international scholars--and additional writings from directors Roberta Torre, Giovanna Taviani, and Costanza Quatriglio--seek to offset the near-absence of scholarship focusing on the relationship between the Mediterranean island and cinema. Touching on class relations, immigration, gender and poverty, the essays examine how Sicily is depicted in fiction, satire and documentaries. Situated between North and South, East and West, innovation and tradition, authenticity and displacement, Sicily acts as a microcosm of the world, a place to explore numerous narratives and develop intercultural dialogue. It is also the center of cinematographic discussions and events such as the Taormina Film Festival and the SalinaDocFest. The volume presents Sicily almost as a character and creator in its own right.
